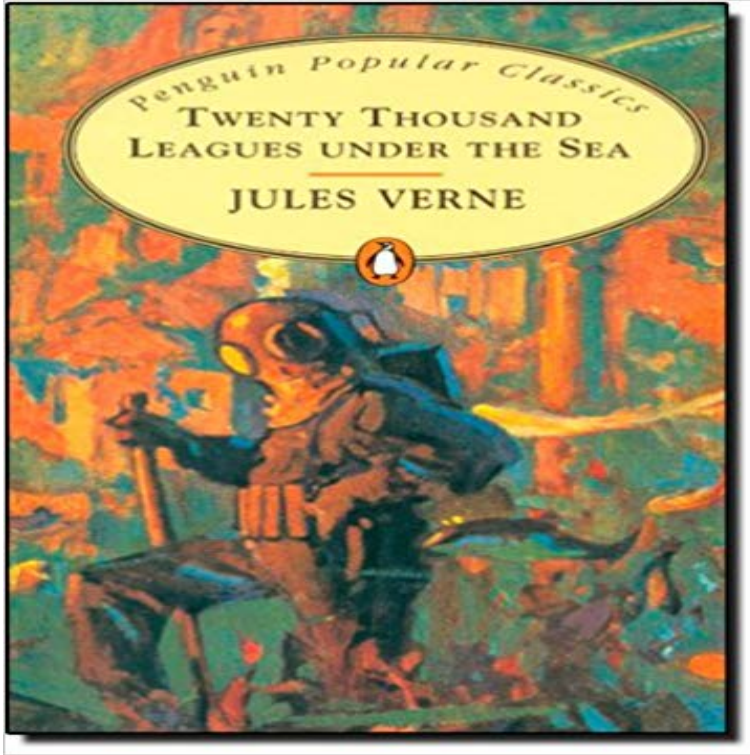


Twenty Thousand Leagues Under the Sea
