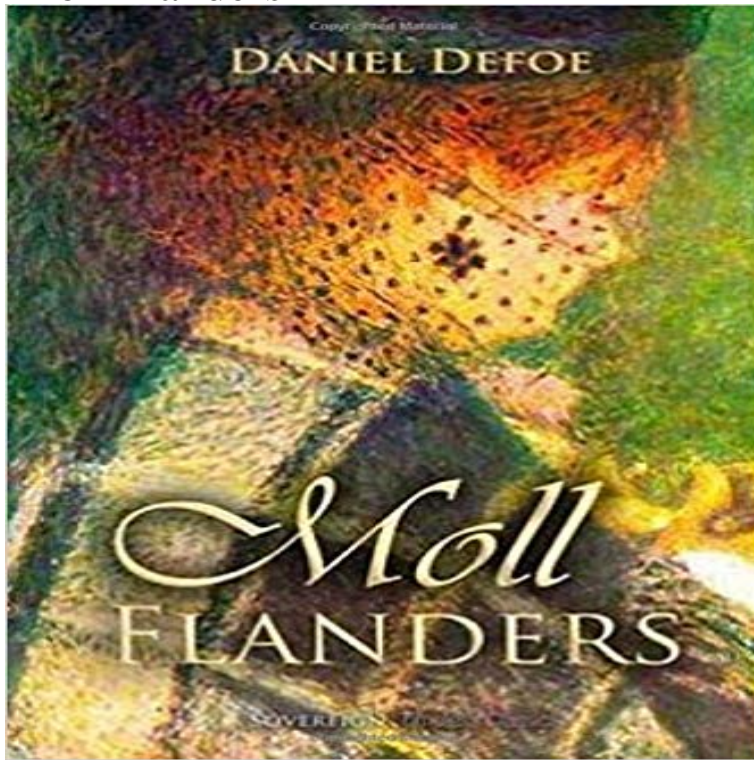


Moll Flanders
