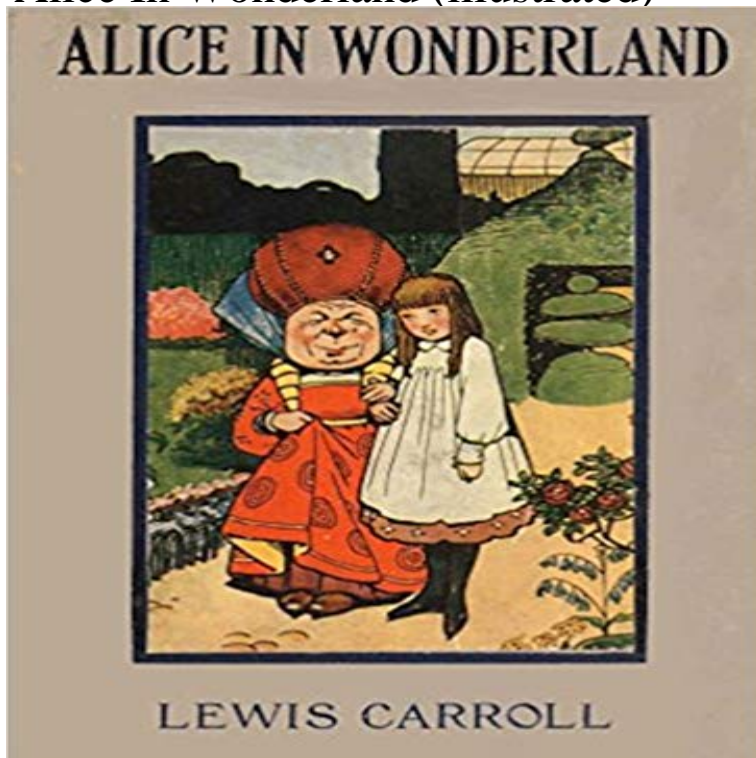


Alice In Wonderland (illustrated)
