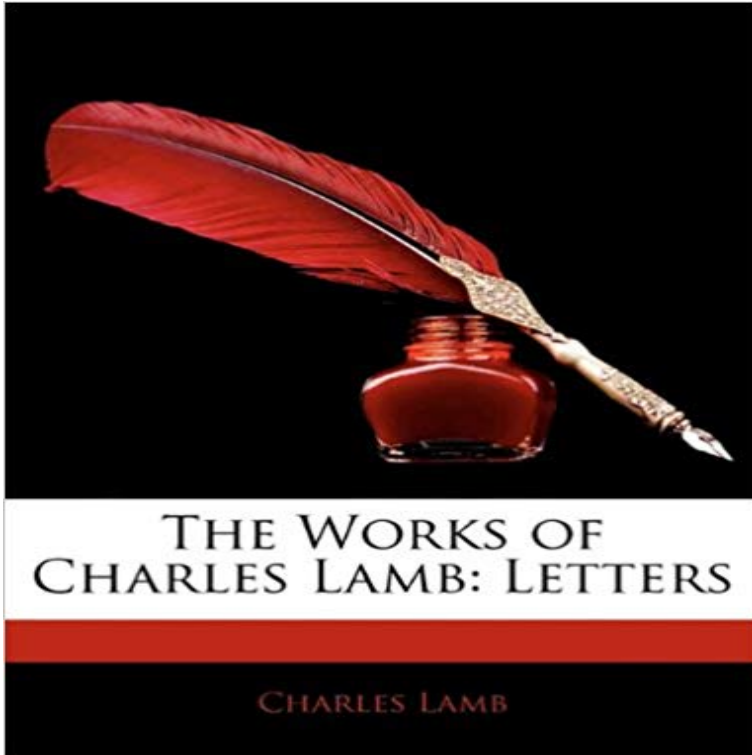


The Works of Charles Lamb: Letters
